EQ: How can Learning Logs be used to support my learning and understanding in class?

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What is a Learning Log?

There are a couple of things you should be thinking about as a student in your classes.

As you engage in new learning activities (lessons), you should think....

What am I supposed to be learning? What does the teacher want me to know or know how to do? **(Know)**

How are the activities I am doing helping me to learn it? What am I doing, and why? (Do)

How will I show that I understand? (Show)

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Why should I write them?

Reflection is a key component of the learning process. It goes like this....



Experience -- You do something in class, or connected to the class (homework).

Reflection -- You think about what you learned from what you did.

Application -- You use what you learned in a new situation.
